As a quasi-judicial board the ZBA will balance the benefit to the applicant with any potential detriment to the health, safety and welfare of the community, and as required by law will consider the following points

Relating to Area Variance

- a. Whether and undesirable change will be produced in the character of the neighborhood or a detriment to nearby properties will be created by the granting of said variance.
- Whether the benefit sought can be achieved by some other feasible method for the applicant to pursue.

Whether the requested variance is substantial.

- Whether the proposed variance will have an adverse effect or impact on the physical or environmental conditions in the neighborhood or district, and
- Whether the alleged difficulty was self-created, which consideration shall be relevant to the decision of the board, but shall not necessarily preclude the granting of the area variance.

Relating to Use Variance

- The applicant cannot realize a reasonable return, provided that lack of return is substantial as demonstrated by competent financial evidence
- That the alleged hardship relating to the property in question is unique, and does not apply to a substantial portion of the district or neighborhood
- That the requested use variance, if granted, will not alter the essential character of the neighborhood;
- That the alleged hardship has not been self-created.
